



## **MEDICAL PROTOCOL SEVERE (ANAPHYLACTIC) ALLERGIC REACTIONS**

Watch for:

Itching and swelling of the lips, tongue or mouth  
Itching and/or a sense of tightness in the throat, hoarseness, hacking cough  
Hives, itchy rash, swelling about the face or extremities  
Nausea, abdominal cramps, vomiting, diarrhea  
Shortness of breath, coughing, wheezing  
Anxiety  
Loss of consciousness

### **NECESSARY CARE –**

If bee sting is witnessed or student knows they have eaten a severe allergen, EPI-PEN should be given immediately by any of the trained staff members listed below\*.  
EPI-PEN is in Main Office and Health Center.

**If student is in severe distress, call 911 and notify the building front office.**

**DO NOT SEND STUDENT TO HEALTH CENTER OR FRONT OFFICE.**

**STAY WITH STUDENT** and keep student calm and quiet.

Call parents or emergency contacts.

If student with known severe allergy has sting or ingested allergen without symptoms, stay with student, monitor closely, and notify the school office or Health Center.

\* **Notify the school office or health center for a list of trained staff members.**
