Adequate supply of face coverings, including location 2. Designated space to isolate student or staff members who develop COVID-19 symptoms. Isolate students and staff who report or develop symptoms, with staff supervision and symptom monitoring by a school nurse or other school-based health care provider, until they are able to go home. While waiting to go home, ill persons should wear a face covering, as should supervising staff. 3.
